From the Superintendent's desk:

As we put a wrap on another successful school year, I want to provide our parents with some information from our April board meeting, pass on a congratulatory note to one our students and my usual May newsletter graduation thoughts for our 15 seniors.

For the past several months I have been informing board members about the possibility of Humphrey Public School receiving an invitation from Lakeview Community Schools or Twin River Public School to form a possible baseball cooperative with Twin River, Lakeview and Lindsay Holy Family. NSAA guidelines allow cooperatives to have four schools, Humphrey Public did receive an invitation from Twin River Public School prior to our April board meeting. With the board's approval, we sent out an interest survey to students in grades 8-11 asking them if they had any interest in participating in a baseball cooperative with Lakeview, Twin River and Lindsay. The cooperative would take place in the spring of the year and games would be played in Genoa. If parents are interested in looking at the survey or if you have any questions, I would be happy to discuss it with you further. The board of education will discuss the results of the survey and discuss the potential cooperative in greater detail at the May school board meeting.



I want to send out a HUGE Bulldog Congratulations to Yasmine Bender. Yasmine was named a State FCCLA officer for the 2018-2019 school year. This is a tremendous honor for Yasmine, she will be part of this leadership team and have the opportunity to travel the state and attend national conferences as a State Officer. To my knowledge, I believe Yasmine is the first student from Humphrey Public School to be named a State Officer from any of our student organizations.

It amazes me on how much students change over the course of the year. It is very exciting to see them growing as individuals and continue to strive for excellence. 






During the month of April and into May, students in grades 3-11 have been completing the statewide accountability assessment. This was the first year for the new assessment and a new name. NSCAS stands for Nebraska Student Centered Assessment System. Students in grades 3-8 have been taking the NSCAS English Language Arts assessment, math assessment, and science assessment. The juniors completed the ACT. I appreciate all of the students' hard work on these assessments. I also want to thank all of the parents for making sure their students were in school while completing these assessments. It really helps having students here on testing days so they don't miss out on other classroom work when having to make them up. To finish up the assessment window for the 2017-2018 school year, students will be completing the second round of MAP testing. This provides very valuable information for both the students and the staff on strengths and areas of focus. We use this data from this assessment to determine interventions for our students, along with monitoring through the year for progress on areas of focus. And finally, the elementary will complete their final DIBELS benchmark assessment.

Our students have worked hard this year and it is time to honor their accomplishments. The Academic Awards Night will be held in Humphrey on Thursday, May 3rd starting at 7:00 p.m. The Humphrey-Lindsay



Holy Family Athletic Awards Night will be held in Humphrey on Tuesday, May 8th starting at 7:00 p.m. For both of these evenings we ask students to please dress up as they are being honored for their hard work and dedication throughout the year. Our elementary students will also be honored for their hard work throughout the year as well. We will be holding our Elementary Awards Day on Monday, May 14th. Students in grades K-2 will be honored from 1:00 p.m. - 2:00 p.m. Kindergarten graduation will be during this time. Students in grades 3-6 will be honored from 2:15 p.m. - 3:30 p.m. I know they look forward to this event and we look forward to having you join us. This event will take place in the gym.

As we are nearing the end of the year, everyone has one thing on their mind. When is the last day of school? The last day for our Seniors is Wednesday, May 9th. They will do graduation practice in the morning and will be dismissed 12:00 p.m. Seniors will be asked to report back Friday, May 11th to help set up for graduation. Seniors that have attendance or grade issues will not be signed out until they have completed their work and made up their time. The last day for students in grades K-6 will be Monday, May 14th, with a

regular 3:36 p.m. dismissal. The last day for students in grades 7-12 will be Tuesday, May 15th, with a regular 3:36 p.m. dismissal. Students that are needing to complete work or make up time will not be signed out until this has been completed.

Even though the school year is coming to an end, it is still important to practice the skills you have learned over the summer. Humphrey Elementary students will again be participating in the summer reading



program. Students will be asked to keep a record of the books they read and the amount of pages that were in the book. A reading log will be sent home with students before the end of the year. In the fall when students return, students will turn in their reading logs. Students who submit the logs will be recognized for their accomplishment and hard work over the summer. Last summer I challenged our students to read over 100,000 pages.

The final count was over 106,000.

You can always check your student loan debt throughout college at <a href="https://www.nslds.ed.gov">www.nslds.ed.gov</a>. I also encourage you to ask for unused scholarships at the schools you are attending along with searching for more on your own. Each year you will also need to fill out your FAFSA in order to receive grant money. As always, if you have any questions or concerns, feel free to contact me in any way.

I am so proud of all of our students at Humphrey Public School. We have such bright young students that are hungry for success. I hope everyone has a safe and enjoyable summer! 

### The Beginning


Humphrey, NE was established as a township in 1883, soon after it began, plans were made to start a school. According to the 1951 History of Platte County, Vol 1, "Soon after the town was laid out, a schoolhouse - a frame building - was erected and fulfilled its purposes until 1889, when it was cast aside and a two-story pressed brick and stone structure was erected at a cost of \$8,000.

This is one of the best educational institutions in Platte County and one of its well conducted graded schools. There are now over 500 children of school age in the district."

The Centennial Edition of the Humphrey Democrat noted that in 1912 a new public school building was erected. A cafeteria and kitchen were added in 1968 and a gym was completed in 1970. In 1973, a Voc-Ag and band room were completed, while in 1982 a number of new classrooms and office space were added.

#### Present Building

Following a bond election in 1999, construction of the present building began. While the school was being built, classes were held in the bus barn as well as a rental home. In January of 2002, students and faculty members were able to move into the new facilities.
