From the Principal's Desk:

On Friday, September 8, we celebrated Grandparents Day. Grandparents were able to come in and have breakfast with their grandchildren. We had an amazing turnout for this event. We served right around 200 individuals that morning. Those that were visiting came from near and far. It is always great to see students and their family members in our building.

Our fall activities are in full swing. It has been great to get out and watch our students compete in their respective activity. I would encourage anyone to take a look at the activities calendar and make a trip out to watch our students compete. The students really appreciate the support at their events. On Friday, August 25 we held our Summer Reading Celebration. Last spring I challenged the elementary students to read 100,000 pages over the summer. Not only did they meet their goal, they surpassed it by over 6,000 pages. The top readers from each class had the opportunity to pie their person of choice in the face. The brave volunteers were Mrs. Bender, Ms. Oelsligle, Mr. Sjuts and myself. Each student who turned in pages received a goody bag. The goody bags were put together with an anonymous donation. At our August board meeting, the board gave the okay for the school to do an update to our current website. We are currently in the process of working with a company to complete a mock-up of the new website. This past year, our staff has been in the process of adopting the Marzano Instructional Framework Model. This model has developed a common language for instruction for our staff. It also is a great tool for increasing the instructional toolbox for our staff. Mr. Sjuts and myself recently attended a Marzano workshop centered on the process of continuous school improvement. Part of the discussion was feedback from a variety of stakeholders on school improvement items. As we continue our discussions on survey information, we ask that if one is sent home to help us complete it. We have discussed ways to keep them short with purposeful feedback. Thank you in advance for your assistance.

This year our kitchen staff is offering a second option to the main menu for both breakfast and lunch. If students are not wanting the main meal, they can choose to have a cold sandwich for lunch and a hot breakfast sandwich in the

morning. The cold sandwich option is also listed on our monthly calendars with the main meal. If students are

wanting the cold sandwich at lunch, they are to email the kitchen staff by 9:00am. This has been a great addition to the lunch and breakfast programs.

Now that we are over a month into school, I wanted to pass along our PIPSS expectations for you to review and continue your discussions with your student(s) at home. Here are the five student performance goals students are expected to follow:

- Arrive to class prepared
- Use work time appropriately
- Complete assigned tasks on-time
- Demonstrate respect for people and property
- Respond appropriately to staff directives

The two that I see the most come across my desk is completing assignments on time and demonstrating respect. It is highly important for students to get their work completed on time and turned in to ensure they receive a grade and get the full points. Demonstrating respect is a key characteristic of life and should be demonstrated on a daily basis.

On Thursday, November 14, we will have The Honor's Breakfast for our students who qualify according to their 1st quarter grades. A student in grades 3-12 who earns a 93% GPA or higher, is placed on the Honor Roll. A student in grades 3-12 who earns an 89% GPA or higher is placed on the Honorable Mention Honor Roll. If a student has a "D" in any class, they are not eligible for Honor Roll. All students grades 3-12 may also be considered for the Merit Honor Roll Award. Students earn this award by following the PIPSS student performance goals and the student academic goal. They need to be nominated by a teacher, or teachers, to receive this award. Please continue to encourage your children to try their hardest and do their best with all of their course work. We still have a few weeks until the breakfast is held. It would be great to see all of our students in attendance. Breakfast will begin serving at 7:00 a.m. We hope to see you there.

I want to remind students and parents of the protocol to follow when your student is absent. It is highly important that your student be in attendance at school. We have a lot to cover over the year to prepare our students for the next grade level and end of the year assessments. It is hard to make sure students understand the material and get it all done when they are missing school. If a student is missing for an illness, please contact the school to let us know they will not be attending. After seeing a doctor for treatment, please make sure you have the doctor's office write a note and submit those to the office. Those are kept on file and used when completing end of the year reports to make sure our attendance is accurate. If your student will be leaving early for an appointment, we need to hear from a parent in the morning before that student leaves for their appointment. We appreciate your assistance with both of these items.

On Tuesday, October 17th we will be hosting a Mom's & Muffins breakfast. All mothers are invited to come and enjoy a muffin for breakfast with their student(s). The doors for breakfast will open at 7:00 am. We hope that you are able to enjoy us.

As I wrap up my letter, please remember that my door is always open if you ever feel the need to talk about any concerns that you may have. If you ever have any questions, please feel free to contact me. Until my next letter, have a great October!

October Health News

On October 10 & 11, 2017 Humphrey Public School planned for East Central District Health Department (ECDHD) staff perform Student Health Screenings on all students in grades K-12. The screenings will include weight and height measurement, hearing evaluation, dental check and vision screening. ECDHD will supply letters to parents of students providing the results.

Halloween Safety

- Make sure your child's costume is safe; use reflective tape for easier visibility once it gets dark.
- Know who your kids are trick or treating with; use the buddy system.
- Remind your kids to stay out of the streets and walk on the sidewalks; do not take shortcuts with alleys.
- Check ALL candy and treats before eating to ensure safety; never eat candy if the package is already opened.
- Consider non-food treats for trick-ortreaters for those children who may have food allergies or restrictions.

How to Report the reason my child is missing school: If your child is sick, it is important to tell the school the signs of the illness. The reason we ask this is for the prevention of spreading and for the weekly reporting to ECDHD for students' absences.

How to Stop the Spread of Germs:

- ◆ If your child has signs of the flu, consult your doctor to see if your child should be examined
- ♦ Keep your child home for 24 hours after their fever is gone without the use of fever lowering medicine
- ♦ Stay away from others who are sick
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze, may use your elbow if you do not have a tissue
- ♦ Try not to touch your eyes, nose, and mouth
- Wash your hands with warm water and soap frequently
- Get plenty of rest and drink lots of sugar free liquids

- 1. Consider taking the ACT. If you have decided to, start preparing for it. www.acto.org is the magic website. If you qualify for free or reduced lunches, let me know and I can provide you with a fee waiver.
- 2. Think about career options and research colleges that have the major you are interested in.
- 3. Work hard, ask questions, and study. Grades matter when getting into college.

11th Grade

- 1. Those that requested a test for the PSAT, it will be on October 19. Refresh your knowledge on English, reading, math, and science concepts. Best of luck!
- 2. Research colleges. Ask questions and go on college visits. Find a career that you are interested in and want to pursue.
- 3. Register and take the ACT. It is best to take the ACT at least two times by the end of your junior year. Visit www.act.org for test dates and registration information. If you qualify for free or reduced lunches, let me know and I can provide you with a fee waiver.

12th Grade

- 1. Retake the ACT if you are not satisfied with your current score. The last two tests accepted by most colleges are October 28 and December 9. Visit www.act.org to get registered.
- 2. Create an FSA ID for yourself and one for a parent. This is needed in order to complete your FAFSA. The FAFSA is available on October 1, much sooner than before. We will be planning a FAFSA night event here at Humphrey to assist with filling out the FAFSA on October 23rd at 7 PM. This is planned to help parents and students with questions you all may have. Visit www.fsaid.ed.gov to create an FSA ID.
- 3. Apply for Scholarships. I have shared a Google Document with all seniors about scholarships that I have been notified of. I will continue to add more as they become available. Visit www.educationquest.org to find even more state and local scholarships under Scholarship Quest.
- 4. Go on college visits and ask questions.
- 5. Attend the school visits when colleges are here at Humphrey High. They provide a lot of helpful information, plus free stuff! ☺
- 6. Continue to check the Scholarship Google Doc that has been shared with you. I add all new scholarships there
