Humphrey rushed for 3216 yards averaging 5.8 yards a carry while holding their opponents to 1177 yards for a 2.44 average. Paul Slizoski averaged 8.1 yards a carry and rushed for 1297 yards and scored 34 touchdowns. Ed Fuxa completed 49 of his 93 passing attempts for 925 yards and 15 touchdowns. Humphrey intercepted 37 passes and ran for 94 touchdowns for a total of 672 points and averaged 56 points per game while the opponents averaged 13 points per game.
