The Bulldogs' finest hour came on January 7 as the team upset Class C Dodge 62-60 in double overtime.

Ted Preister led the way to victory with 23 points.
The most disappointing setback came in the first round of district play. The Bulldogs went down to defeat in 56-54 overtime. Victory seemed to be within reach, but a few last second mistakes cost us the win. Ted Preister turned in a brilliant performance as he poured in 35 points. Freshman Robb Alderson added 17 points. Ted led the way for the Bulldogs throughout the season, as he was team leader in both scoring and rebounding. He was All-Conference in both Mid-State and Sand-hills-Gateway. Ted was also named honorable-mention All-State by the Lincoln Star Journal.

Track seemed to be THE sport at H.H.S. this year--for the girls and the guys both. We had some outstanding athletes who put the time and effort in to make a really great team. All total, they participated in eight varsity meets and two Freshman-Sophomore meets. Outstanding Performances:

GREG BRANDL, who had a hard time NOT capturing first place. His main events were the 880, mile, and 2 -mile, where he set several meet records and qualified for the State Meet. At State, he set a school and State Class D record time of $9: 43.7$ in the 2-mile. He also placed first in the 880 and second in the mile at State.

PAT GRONENTHAL was our favorite high jumper, placing in four of the eight major meets. He captured third place at the Kearney Invitational, and we're expecting even better things out of him next year.

RANDY MELCHER, another distance runner, follows close behind Greg in the 2mile. He placed third in this event at the District Meet, just missing qualifying for State.

The TWO-MILE RELAY TEAM of Dan Krings, Matt BrandI, Paul Krings, and Greg Brandl set a school record time of 8:39.3 at the Howells Invitational.

At the Howells Invitational, the Team took eighth place, thanks to Lola's meet record times in the 880 and the 440 , and her second place ribbon in the 100 yard dash.

The underclassmen took fourth place at the Sandhills-Gateway Freshman-Sophomore Meet, with Sherry Baumgart placing second in the long jump, Deb Rosenthal placing fifth in the 100 yard dash, and Barb Schmidt taking fourth in the 80 yard hurdles and third in the 220.
