The month of March started off with the Humphrey-Lindsay Holy Family Bulldog girls' basketball team participating in the Class D-1 State Basketball tournament, played with tremendous heart, and took Archbishop Bergan down to the wire before losing in the first-round game. The second week of March, the Humphrey-Lindsay Holy Family Bulldog boys' basketball team traveled to Lincoln to beat Southern Valley, North Platte St. Patrick's, and Howells-Dodge in consecutive days to win the Class D-1 Boys State Basketball championship trophy. The championship game vs Howells-Dodge was an awesome game. The Bulldog team showed tremendous resilience and determination to fight back and win the game in overtime to earn the title.

The third week of March, the Humphrey Bulldog Speech team traveled to Kearney for the Class D-1 State Speech meet. Mrs. Hogancamp and Mrs. Lovercheck had the speech students prepared and they rocked Kearney High School winning the Class D-1 State Speech Championship outscoring runner-up Wausa 124-120. The entire speech team did an awesome job and I believe they were on a mission to win the championship after not being able to participate in last year's speech meet due to COVID-19. A special congratulations to Oriana Kuehler who won three individual gold medals in Entertainment, Poetry, and Serious Prose. Based on information from the NSAA, Oriana is the first student to win three gold medals since they started allowing students to participate in three different events. This is a remarkable achievement, congratulations Oriana!!!

The accomplishments of the girls' basketball team, the boys' basketball team, and the speech team are outstanding and something we will cherish for a long time. Winning is a direct result of tremendous leadership and guidance by our coaches, as well as a lot of hard work by students during the season and in the summer. When you combine outstanding leadership with students who are willing to put in countless hours and work hard to excel, you are going to have fantastic programs and that is exactly what we have at Humphrey Public School. Congratulations to the girls' basketball team, the boys' basketball team, the speech team and all the coaches on your outstanding seasons! - 4. As always, please continue to research future careers and colleges. Campus visits are huge in helping to determine a good fit for you. Please, let me know if you would like me to set up a visit or if you would like to do so on your own. Job Shadows are good opportunities to look at future careers as well. If you need help with this, please let me know.

12th Grade:
