After the board of education meeting on December 11, 2023 a survey was sent out through the school messaging system as well as on the district's social media pages and website requesting feedback on the failed bond initiative. District patrons also could stop by Bank of the Valley, Pinnacle Bank, Humphrey Democrat and Bank of Lindsay to fill out a paper copy and drop it in a drop box at those locations. If you attended an HLHF home basketball game in December, there were paper copies and a drop box available for surveys as well. The survey was also advertised in the Humphrey Democrat for two weeks. We greatly appreciate the feedback that was provided for the board of education to review and consider in moving forward. The feedback collected was generally positive and understands there is a need for additional space in our building to enhance the educational opportunities for our students now and well into the future. The data from this survey will be shared with district patrons in the near future.

The Nebraska Department of Education has released the Accountability for a Quality Education System, Today and Tomorrow (AQuESTT) classifications. It is with great excitement that I share that Humphrey Public School District was classified as GREAT! There are four areas for classification, which are NEEDS SUPPORT FOR IMPROVEMENT, GOOD, GREAT, EXCELLENT. In 2022, our district was classified as GOOD. We continue to use district data to drive educational decisions regarding professional development for staff and curriculum development/alignment to help prepare our students for district and state assessments. We have shown continued improvement and are determined to continue our upward growth trend. The growth we are seeing academically is a true testament to our fantastic staff and the hard work our students put in to achieve this success!

The January activities calendar is quite busy. Check it out and we hope that you are able to come out and support our teams. Our Speech season will be getting underway in January. There will be multiple opportunities to support them as they have a lot of area meets. We will be hosting our Humphrey Speech meet on Saturday, February 10.

Even more, I hope it was a wonderful year, but 2024 is an even better one. The first semester has flown by, and it has been so fun to be a part of some great accomplishments. I look forward to this upcoming semester, and the opportunity to work with some of the best students, families, and faculty around. Every day is a great day to be a Bulldog!

Elementary Guidance: The past month we have worked with spreading cheer during the winter season, remembering our manners, and understanding how our words can hurt people, but also help them. The fifth and sixth graders have both began to work with colleges. Research shows, the earlier we expose our students to colleges and the idea of going, the more likely they are to attend. I make sure to mention that college may not be the path for everyone, but our Humphrey Public research shows that 94% or more of our students attend college at some point in their lives. Therefore, by instructing with a focus on college, it is not that I want to discredit the work force as we also discuss that; it is simply to share information a large majority of our students will need to know for their future. If you or your child ever has any questions about their future, please don't hesitate to reach out to me or have them do so. In the upcoming months, we will continue to discuss future career options and college opportunities. We will also continue working on the characteristics it takes to be a good person.

7th-9th Grades:

- Keep working hard. This is a new semester and a chance to get or keep your grades where you would like them. Decide now, where you want to be in your upper high school years. Good grades, attendance, and school participation lead to more scholarships and more opportunities. The sky is the limit for all of you. Don't settle for anything less. Remember to be involved, cheer your classmates and schoolmates on, and to stay caught up.
- 2. A good idea for the future is to start writing down any activities you are involved in, any awards you may have received, and any volunteering you have done. Keep this in a Google Doc or similar location so that you will have the information when it comes time to create a resume.
- 3. Also, remember to start thinking about your future and different careers you might find interesting.

10th-11th Grades:

- 1. As with the 7-9 grades, you have an opportunity at a new semester to perform how you want. Don't waste this opportunity. With a new beginning, you can achieve whatever you put your minds to.
- 2. As you all continue to think about future careers, I highly encourage you to consider going on Job Shadows. The best way to determine if a career is for you is to get out and see what goes on in that career.
- 3. I also encourage you all to consider different colleges and for the 11th graders, start taking college visits. That is also the best way to see if a college is the perfect fit for you. Again, many of these are also virtual. It can't quite replace actually being there, but the virtual visits typically provide good information and a good overview of the college and campus.
- 4. Continue to save money for college along with keeping track of all activities you've been in and awards you have received. Compiling all of this information into a resume would be a great idea and save you stress in the future.
- 5. Be thinking about people who would be able and willing to write you letters of recommendation. It is a good idea to have these individuals in mind before your senior year so that you are prepared for scholarships and applications.

6. As always, it is good to look at applying for the ACT. That can be done at <u>www.act.org</u> 12th Grade:

- 1. You are in your final semester of high school. It is bittersweet, but remember to finish strong. Even if you are accepted and have received financial aid to college, it is still important to finish this final semester to the best of your ability.
- 2. I suggest that you all speak with a staff member and have at least one letter of recommendation completed along with a community member with a second letter. This will aid you in applying for scholarships and possibly admission.
- 3. The FAFSA is still making changes. There are times where it is available, but there are times when it is not. I encourage you to check on the webpage, but if it is not working at that time to check back in a day or two.
- 4. Many of the big scholarship deadlines, such as Susan Buffet, are right around the corner. I encourage you to fill out as many scholarships as possible. If I can ever be of assistance to you, please stop in and see me. The financial portion of this is being extended due to the FAFSA.
- 5. Also, try to begin narrowing your search on a college. In order to have the best opportunities at colleges for housing and scholarships, it is best to be decided by February. If you are not certain, there is still time, but do your best to narrow it down. If you have not been on the campus of the school you are interested in, I would suggest setting up a college visit so you can be sure it is the best college for you.
