Where did the time go? I can't believe that we are nearing the end of another school year! As always, I hope this letter finds everyone doing well. It has been a great joy to work with each student and staff this school year. It amazes me on how much students change over the course of the year. It is very exciting to see them growing as individuals and continue to strive for excellence.

During the month of April and into May, students in grades 3-8 have been completing the statewide accountability assessment. NSCAS stands for Nebraska Student Centered Assessment System. Students in grades 3-8 have been taking the NSCAS English Language Arts assessment, math assessment, and science assessment. I appreciate all of the students' hard work on these assessments. NSCAS assessment results will be finalized next fall and results will be sent home to parents when they become available. I also want to thank all of the parents for making sure their students were in school while completing these assessments. It really helps having students here on testing days so they don't miss out on other classroom work when having to make them up. To finish up the assessment window for the 2021-2022 school year, the elementary will complete their final Acadiance benchmark assessment.

Humphrey Public School will be hosting a Preschool Open House on Monday, May 2, 2022 at 5:30pm. The open house is for families that are interested in our Preschool program and would like to take a tour and meet our preschool teacher, Mrs. Droescher. There will also be an Early Childhood Resource teacher from the ESU available for families that have children ages birth to five that might have some developmental concerns or questions. This is part of our required child find obligations. We hope you are able to join us for this event!

Each year you will also need to fill out your FAFSA in order to receive grant money. As always, if you have any questions or concerns, feel free to contact me in any way.


