

From the Superintendent's desk:

Rather than starting my newsletter out with information dealing with the pandemic, I thought I would use part of my newsletter to recognize and thank our nine school board members for their outstanding leadership and dedication. This group of nine are very instrumental in providing our students a high-quality education, setting policy for our district, and helping set tax levies for the various school funds. I am very appreciative of their time and commitment to our school. There is not a lot of glory and fame in being a school board member, and typically they don't receive the recognition or appreciation they truly deserve. Generally speaking, the only time they hear from district patrons is when they are upset about something or someone at school. School board members dedicate their time and efforts trying to provide the students at Humphrey Public School the best education possible. I've appreciated their willingness to work together and listen/respect other's opinions and ideas. The one common theme with our current board of nine is they always base their decisions on what is best for our student's education.

Greetings from the Counselor,

I can't believe we are in the month of October already. I hope that everyone's year is off to a wonderful start. It makes me so happy that we have been able to stay with in-person learning thus far and hope it continues. Always remember, if there is anything I can ever do to assist you, please, let me know. As the uncertain year continues, students, please speak with your parents/guardians, and parents/guardians, please speak with your students about what goes on at school and what major events are coming up. If you ever have any questions, please, reach out to me. I am happy to help.

Elementary: We have been focusing on our emotions. This includes identifying emotions, understanding them, coping with them, and the ways in which we can work to control them. We've focused on the topic of mindfulness and making sure all students have necessary strategies with the uncertain year. I encourage all of you to ask your child about their grounding technique or deep breathing. We will move in to proper treatment of our classmates to also address bullying. Continue to encourage your students to think about their future and excite them for it. Help them explore and fulfill their curiosity! 7-9th grades: I would like to share a couple of tips and tricks to find success in the future.

- 1. Take school seriously. Make sure we are giving our best efforts. Study, work hard, and ask questions. Your grades do matter now. GPA is beginning to matter, especially 8th and 9th grade year. The grades you earn now will be on your transcript and play a huge role in gaining college admission.
- 2. Colleges have started to base their decisions for scholarships and admission more on a student's GPA and less on his/her ACT score.
- 3. Think about different career options and start exploring the possibilities.
- 4. Attend school events to help build Bulldog Pride!
- 5. Saving money now will help in the long run.
- 6. Create and keep a list of all accomplishments, awards, and activities that you have earned so far. You will want this information to place on your future resume. If you write it down now, you will save time in the future.
- 7. You all have access to an *On to College* account where you have access to test prep already. For those of you motivated and ready to start preparing for the ACT now, this is

a huge resource. <u>www.ontocollege.com</u> You all would have received an email with log in instructions, but if you are struggling, please reach out to me.

10th Grade

- 1. Consider taking the ACT. If you have decided to, start preparing for it. <u>www.act.org</u> is the magic website. If you qualify for free or reduced lunches, let me know and I can provide you with a fee waiver.
- 2. You all also have access to a personalized *On to College* account to help you prepare for all levels of testing. I strongly suggest taking advantage of this earlier as opposed to later.
- 3. Think about career options and research colleges that have the major you are interested in.
- 4. Work hard, ask questions, and study. Grades matter when getting into college.
- 5. We will take the Pre-ACT on October 13th.

11th Grade

- 1. We will be taking the PSAT on October 13th. Refresh your knowledge on English, reading, math, and science concepts. Best of luck!
- 2. For additional prep work, you all are in a "PSAT/SAT" prep course on *On to College*. The PSAT can qualify you for a major scholarship. I highly encourage you to take advantage of the prep courses as they have proven successful in the previous years.
- 3. Research colleges. Ask questions and go on college visits. Find a career that you are interested in and want to pursue.
- 4. Register and take the ACT. It is best to take the ACT at least two times by the end of your junior year. Visit <u>www.act.org</u> for test dates and registration information. If you qualify for free or reduced lunches, let me know and I can provide you with a fee waiver.

12th Grade

- 1. Retake the ACT if you are not satisfied with your current score. The last two tests accepted by most colleges are October and December; however, some colleges will accept scores past these deadlines. Visit <u>www.act.org</u> to get registered.
- 2. Create an FSA ID for yourself and one for a parent. This is needed in order to complete your FAFSA. The FAFSA is available on October 1, much sooner than years before. We will be planning a FAFSA night event here at Humphrey to assist with filling out the FAFSA. Please, watch the mail for more details. This is planned to help parents and students with questions you all may have. We will also begin filling out the FAFSA to assist as much as possible. Visit <u>www.fsaid.ed.gov</u> to create an FSA ID.
- 3. Apply for Scholarships. I continue to share with all seniors about scholarships that I have been notified of through their school email. I will continue to do so as more become available. Visit <u>www.educationquest.org</u> to find even more state and local scholarships under *Scholarship Quest*.
- 4. Go on college visits and ask questions.
- 5. Attend the school visits when colleges are here at Humphrey High. They provide a lot of helpful information, plus free stuff! ☺
